He executed a human resource strategy in support of the overall USCP mission and strategic direction.

Previously, Mr. Anderson was Assistant Director for Application Services at the Department of Justice. He developed and managed an expansive IT portfolio valued at over \$50M, delivering IT solutions to the DOJ enterprise, collaborating across 36 headquarters and component offices, boards and divisions that included FBI, DEA, ATF, EOUSA, and U.S. Trustees.

Earlier, he was detailed as Deputy Chief Information Officer (DCIO) at the U.S. Marshals Service (USMS), where he served as the principal advisor on all matters involving the management, administration, direction and control of IT programs of broad scope and complexity in the USMS Enterprise IT portfolio.

As the Director of the Law Enforcement Systems Division of Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Mr. Anderson led and managed the Homeland Security Investigations, Law Enforcement systems portfolio within the Enforcement Systems Branch, which had an annual IT budget of over \$80M. He provided full-service strategic planning, system installations, system conversions and integrations, process improvement, requirements definition, communication management, and other related services to Homeland Security Investigations, Secure Communities, and the Office of International Affairs, directorates of ICE.
